Celebrating Pentecost Fifty Days Later

This weekend we celebrate the great feast of Pentecost. Some of you may wonder, "What is the origin of Pentecost in the Catholic Church?" The word Pentecost is Greek for "pentecostes" which means "fiftieth." This feast commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles, and takes its name from the fact that it comes fifty days after Easter. It was a Jewish festival, and has been observed in the Christian Church since the days of the apostles. It is often called Whitsunday (White Sunday) from the practice of giving solemn Baptism on that day in early centuries, the candidates being attired in white baptismal robes. Pentecost also marks the end of the Easter Season.

## A Prayer on the Feast of Pentecost

Lord Jesus Christ, You told the disciples to expect the gift of the Holy Spirit, Yet, when it came it took them by surprise, bursting into their lives in a way beyond all their expectations. Suddenly life was transformed for them, full of untold possibilities. You tell us also to expect the gift of the Holy Spirit, yet we too are taken by surprise. You want to transform our lives to open the door of new horizons, but often we close our hearts or tie you down to our own expectations. Lord Jesus, As we remember today, that day of Pentecost long ago, help us to open our lives to the movement of your spirit. Amen

PARISH RELIGIOUS EDUCATION PROGRAM REGISTRATION for the Parish Religious Education Program (CCD) is now being taken

for 2012-2013. Those registered at Saint Philip's with an incoming child in Kindergarten and Grade 1 already received a letter and registration form. Those currently enrolled have already received their materials. The cost of the program is \$175 for one child and \$225 for 2 or more children. If you only have one or more children in Kindergarten, the cost is \$100. Kindergarten classes are on Sunday mornings from 10:00-10:50 AM. Grades 1-6 have classes on Monday and Tuesday afternoons from 4:00-5:30 PM. Bus transportation is available from Whitemarsh Elementary, Ridge Park, and Colonial Elementary both days for \$50 per family. A child needs to attend only one class per week. The day of choice will be limited to the number of children who can ride the bus meeting a safe and legal limit. Thank you to our 7<sup>th</sup> grade for hosting their parish breakfast. This is an annual service project where parishioners are invited for breakfast after the 8:30am mass. The seventh grade did a great job as they escorted their guests to the cafeteria, served a delicious breakfast, and spent time visiting with some parishioners. After reading <u>Night</u>, by Elie Wiesel, and <u>The Diary of Anne-Frank</u>, the 8<sup>th</sup> grade had a very special person visit their

classroom. Anneilese Nossbaum, a holocaust survivor from the Philadelphia Holocaust Awareness Museum, recounted her experiences in a concentration camp. Her biggest message to the students was to be grateful for what you have and to "not stay silent when something wrong is happening." It was a visit that the students enjoyed while bringing a real awareness to the reality of that point in history. SPN also had a visit from state representative Mike Gerber. Mr. Gerber was here to help the 4<sup>th</sup> grade better understand how our government works. After being split into the House and Senate, a bill was passed that approved our state cookie! This time of year brings the annual 8th grade science fair. Students research and present their science project where a panel of judges decides on a winner, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, and honorable mention. The kids work extremely hard, over a period of a few months, to complete their independent inquiries. Reading Olympics was recently held at Colonial Middle School. Teams of students, from 5<sup>th</sup> -8<sup>th</sup> grade, competed in this reading competition where designated books were to be read with questions to be answered. All of our teams did a great job and should be commended for their dedication to reading. Well done! Bishop DeSimone was here in April for the Sacrament of Confirmation. Our 6<sup>th</sup> grade received the gifts of the Holy Spirit during a most holy celebration.
