Our Mother of Consolation Spirituality & Theology Book Group invites you to a discussion of Adam: God's Beloved by Henri J.M. Nouwen

Henri J.M. Nouwen (1932-1996) is an internationally renowned priest and author, respected professor and beloved pastor. Henri Nouwen wrote over 40 books on the spiritual life. Since his death in 1996, ever-increasing numbers of readers, writers, teachers and seekers have been guided by his literary legacy. Nouwen's books have sold over 2 million copies and been published in over 22 languages. His past works include; "Return of the Prodigal Son" and "Life of the Beloved". In the final year before his death, Nouwen, began to write an account of the death of his friend Adam, a severely handicapped young man from the L'Arche Daybreak Community. In the story of Adam he found a way to describe his own understanding of the Gospel message. Adam could not speak or even move without assistance. Gripped by frequent seizures, he spent his life in obscurity. And yet, for Nouwen, he became a friend, teacher, and guide. It was Adam who led Nouwen to a new understanding of his faith and what it means to be Beloved of God. Through this story, Nouwen found a new way to tell God's story and the story of all of us human creatures. broken and yet beloved, who live in a world charged and alive with the mystery of God s love. Completed only weeks before Nouwen's own death, Adam became a final, precious gift, a fitting reflection of his own message and legacy. This is a short book (136 pages) that one can order from Amazon (lots of cheap used copies are available) and read quickly before attending the first meeting of the book group. All are most welcome!
