PARISH RELIGIOUS EDUCATION PROGRAM

REGISTRATION for the Parish Religious Education

Program (CCD) is now being taken for 2015-2016. Those registered at Saint Philip's with an incoming child in Kindergarten and Grade 1 already received a letter and registration form. Those currently enrolled have already received their materials. The cost of the program is \$200 for one child and \$225 for 2 or more children. If you only have one or more children in Kindergarten, the cost is \$100. Kindergarten classes are on Sunday mornings from 10:00-10:50 AM . Grades 1-6 have classes on Monday and Tuesday afternoons from 4:00-5:30 PM. Bus transportation is available from Whitemarsh Elementary, Ridge Park, and Colonial Elementary both days for \$50 per family. A child needs to attend only one class per week. The day of choice will be limited to the number of children who can ride the bus meeting a safe and legal limit. If you like children, have faith in God, and would like to get involved at Saint Philip's we will supply you with catechetical training, teaching manuals, and resources. The World Meeting of Families Update

The WMOF will engage the entire region and attract millions of visitors from over 150 nations looking to be a part of history as Pope Francis makes his first papal visit to the United States this September. To help commemorate the historic occasion and create a lasting legacy in our community, the World Meeting of Families and the City of Philadelphia Mural Arts Program have commissioned world-renowned artist Cesar Viveros to develop a beautiful, family-themed mural that will capture the essence of this year's 2015 World Meeting of Families theme, "Love Is Our Mission: The Family Fully Alive."

The completed mural, titled *The Sacred Now: Faith* and *Family in the 21st Century*, will transform the brick façade of the new St. Malachy School campus into a vibrant Philadelphia landmark that will be a symbol of pride for the students, faculty and surrounding neighborhoods. With a long and storied place in the Catholic community of Philadelphia, St. Malachy's roots go back to 1850 when it was known as the "Church in the Woods," paying homage to its location on the rural outskirts of the city.
