PARISH RELIGIOUS EDUCATION PROGRAM

REGISTRATION for the Parish Religious Education Program (CCD) is now being taken for 2015-2016. Those registered at Saint Philip's with an incoming child in Kindergarten and Grade 1 already received a letter and registration form. Those currently enrolled have already received their materials. The cost of the program is \$200 for one child and \$225 for 2 or more children. If you only have one or more children in Kindergarten, the cost is \$100. Kindergarten classes are on Sunday mornings from 10:00-10:50 AM . Grades 1-6 have classes on Monday and Tuesday afternoons from 4:00-5:30 PM. Bus transportation is available from Whitemarsh Elementary, Ridge Park, and Colonial Elementary both days for \$50 per family. A child needs to attend only one class per week. The day of choice will be limited to the number of children who can ride the bus meeting a safe and legal limit. If you like children, have faith in God, and would like to get involved at Saint Philip's we will supply you with catechetical training, teaching manuals, and resources. Pope Francis to use the Gettysburg Lectern The World Meeting of Families - Philadelphia 2015 recently announced that **Pope Francis** will use the Gettysburg Lectern, which was used by President Abraham Lincoln to deliver the Gettysburg Address on November 19, 1863, for his historic address at **Independence Hall** on Saturday, September 26.

The Lectern comes courtesy of The Abraham Lincoln Foundation of The Union League of Philadelphia ("the ALF"), from which President Lincoln spoke just 272 words in dedicating part of the battlefield as the first National Soldiers Cemetery.

Discover paintings, sculptures, and architectural spaces inspired by the Christian faith at the Philadelphia Museum of Art

In celebration of the World Meeting of Families and Pope Francis's visit to Philadelphia, this self-guided walking tour introduces you to several of the Museum's most beautiful and moving images of Christian faith from the Middle Ages and Renaissance, with a particular emphasis on depictions of Saint Francis of Assisi (c. 1181–1226). This specially designed, self-guided walking tour is free after general admission.
