Pentecost is a Greek word meaning "50th day." Fifty days after Easter we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and their followers marking the beginning of their ministry to make disciples of all nations. It is also a Jewish holiday celebrating the end of Passover. The Jewish people celebrate the gift of the Law to Moses and as Catholics we celebrate the birth of the Church. The symbols of Pentecost are the flame, wind and the dove which represent the Holy Spirit. The color of Pentecost is red, symbolizing the blood Christ shed on the Cross for our redemption.
