Gaudete Sunday

The 3rd Sunday of Advent is sometimes called Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete is Latin meaning "to rejoice" taken from the Entrance Antiphon. The candle in the Advent Wreath is a rose color as well as the priest's vestments (Rose vestments are used only 2 X's, today and the 4th Sunday of Lent). Although it takes place during the usually penitential period of Advent, it serves as a mid-point break in expectation as we draw ever nearer to the Solemnity of Christmas.
