Why was Jesus Baptized?

Jesus, who had no need of baptism (from the Greek "to immerse"), came to be baptized by John as a symbolic gesture connecting Himself to the broken world of humanity into which He came to redeem and save. He was setting a precedent for those who would follow Him showing them the necessity of Baptism for their own salvation. It has been observed that just as Jesus' baptism marked the beginning of His public ministry, so our baptism marks a new beginning for us on our road back to God, our Father. Our baptism symbolizes our death in the Lord and resurrection into new life.
