Epiphany means "manifestation"; it comes from Greek roots that mean "to show". The epiphany is the manifestation, the showing, of Jesus as the promised Messiah of Israel. The Gospel narrative speaks of Magi who are seeking among the Jews the one who will be king of the nations; they come to Jerusalem (City of David) the center of Judaism. So we have pagans who turn to the Jews to search for the promised Messiah that was foretold in Hebrew Scriptures (Old Testament). This merging of cultures testifies to the fact that Jesus came for all, not just the Jewish people, and His destiny to be the salvation of all mankind was freely offered to all nations. The Magi were named in writings of a 6th century monk, St. Bede. Their names were Melchoir, Gaspar and Balthasar. Bede also suggests they represent the three known races at the time: European, Asian and African. St. John Chrysostom describes the gifts they brought, "For by gold the power of a king is signified, by frankincense the honor of God, by myrrh as man." Legend has it that they were eventually converted by St. Thomas the Apostle and became bishops and at the end of their lives the Christmas Star revisited them for a final reunion. In any case, we have our own epiphany at our Baptism and at every Eucharist where Jesus is manifested / shown to us once again.




