

Dear St. Philip Neri Families & Friends

We give praise and thanks to God for the graces He has given us. In the Gospel of Matthew (22:15-21), we encounter a pivotal moment in which the Pharisees sought to trap Jesus by posing a question about paying taxes to Caesar. Jesus, in His wisdom and divine insight, replied, "Render to Caesar the things that are Caesar's to God the things that are God's". This response carries profound implications for our lives as Catholic Christians, and it resonates powerfully with the message of St. Pope John Paul II's iconic homily, "Be not afraid". In these words of Christ, we are reminded of our dual citizenship: one as citizens of the earthly realm, and the other as citizens of God's heavenly kingdom. It's a delicate balance, but Jesus encourages us to fulfill our civic obligations while also tending to our spiritual responsibilities. St. Pope John Paul II, in his memorable homily, "Be not afraid", implored us to embrace courage in our faith journey. He understood that living out one's faith in the modern world could be challenging, and he encouraged believers to overcome fear and embrace the truth and love of Christ. The convergence of these two messages reminds us that our faith should not be confined to the four walls of a church. We are called to be active participants in the world., living our faith in the public square. Just as we render to Caesar our civic duties, we must also render to God what is rightfully His by living according to His commandments and principles. "Be not afraid" is a powerful reminder that, in a world filled with uncertainty and challenges, our faith is our anchor. Just as Christ's response to the Pharisees emphasized a balance between the temporal and the spiritual, St. Pope John Paul II's words remind us that our faith equips us to face the world's trials with unwavering hope and courage. The phrase "Be not afraid" signifies the courage to live our faith boldly, regardless of the pressures and expectations of the secular world. It's a call to be witnesses to Christ's love, even when it seems challenging. This courage should guide our actions as we navigate our dual citizenship, giving to Caesar what is due in our temporal obligations, and giving God what is due in our eternal commitment. In essence, the Gospel message of rendering to God and Caesar is a call to be conscientious citizens of both realms, honoring our faith while also fulfilling our earthly duties. St. Pope John Paul II's "Be not afraid" serves as a beacon of hope, urging us to do so with courage and conviction. Today as we reflect on Matthew 22:15-21 and the inspiring words of St. Pope John Paul II, may we be inspired to live our faith without fear, knowing that we are called to be both responsible citizens of our nations and steadfast disciples of Christ. May we render to Caesar our civic duties, and to God our unwavering love and devotion, secure in the knowledge that, with God's grace, we need not be afraid of the journey ahead.



When death is imminent, it serves as "Last Rites" which include a special Apostolic Pardon. Please do not delay in calling for your elderly or chronically ill family member.

Sacrament of Baptism

Baptisms are scheduled for the 2nd & 4th Sunday of every month immediately following the 11AM Mass. For first time parents, Pre-Jordan classes are required. Godparents are required to obtain Letters of Eligibility; these letters are due at the Parish Office at least one week before the scheduled baptismal date.
