Dear St. Philip Neri Family and Friends

We give praise and thanks to God for the graces and blessings He has given us. This Sunday, we hear one of the most comforting and profound images Jesus gives us: **He is the Good Shepherd, and we are His sheep.** I love the image of Jesus as Our Good Shepherd. In today's short but powerful Gospel from John, Jesus says; *"My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish."* There is something deeply personal and intimate about the relationships between a shepherd and his sheep. In Jesus'

time, shepherds lived among their flock's day and night. They knew every sheep individually – not just by appearance, but by the way each one moved, the way each one responded to the shepherd's voice. The sheep, in turn, knew their shepherd. They trusted him because he protected them, provided for them, guided them safely through dangerous territory. Jesus tells us that we are His sheep – not in a way that belittles us, but in a way that highlights our absolute reliance on Him for everything that matters: for truth, for guidance, for life itself. He knows each of us intimately. He knows our strengths and weaknesses, our fears and hopes. And still, He calls us by name. His voice is not one of harsh commands, but one of love and invitation. The challenge for us is to *listen* for His voice amidst the noise of the world. Every day we are bombarded with competing voices – voices promising happiness through wealth, power, pleasure, or popularity. But only one voice leads to real peace, real joy, and real life; the voice of our Good Shepherd. How do we recognize His voice? Through prayer, through Scripture, through the Sacraments, and through the life of the Church.

When we make space for quiet prayer, when we open the Word of God with a listening heart, when we receive the Eucharist with reverence and gratitude, the voice of Jesus grows clearer to us. And the more we follow Him, the better we learn to trust where He leads. Jesus makes a beautiful promise today: *I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish.*

No one can take them out of my hand." Think about that for a moment. In a world where so much seems uncertain – where health can fail, relationships can struggle, and plans can fall apart – Jesus tells us that we are safe in His hands. Not even the greatest power in this world, not even death itself, can take us away from Him if we stay close to Him. Today, we also celebrate the World Day of Prayer for Vocations. On Good Shepherd Sunday, the Church asks us to pray in a special way for vocations to the priesthood, to the diaconate, and to religious life. These vocations are concrete ways that men and women live out the call to shepherd God's people. But today is also a chance to remember that *every* Christian is called to be a shepherd in some way – whether as a parent, a teacher, a friend, a servant of the poor, or simply someone who leads others closer to Christ through love and example. So today, let us ask ourselves: **Whose voice are we listening to?** Are we tuning our ears and hearts to the voice of the Good Shepherd, or are we following the many false voices of the world? And let us pray that more men and women will have the courage to answer the call to shepherd God's people – to be His hands, His voice, and His heart in a world that so desperately needs Him. Jesus, our Good Shepherd, we trust in

You. Lead us always along the right paths, until we are safely gathered into Your Father's house.

May God bless you all.

Baptism

Baptisms are scheduled on the 2nd & 4th Sunday of every month immediately following the 11AM Mass.

Godparents need Letters of Eligibility, for first time parents the Pre-Jordan Class is required. Call the Church Office at 610-834-1975 to make arrangements.

Marriage

Arrangements must be made with a priest at least 6 months prior to wedding date. Pre-Cana classes are required, contact Church office at 610-834-1975.

Anointing of the Sick

Primarily intended as prayers and anointing for healing from serious illness or as a spiritual preparation before surgery. Last Rites or Extreme Unction are for those in danger of imminent death. Call rectory or Church Office.
