Dear St. Philip Neri Friends and Family,

We give praise and thanks to God for the graces and blessings He has given us! The Gospel this Sunday is a challenging one. Jesus tells us that to be His disciple we must be willing to renounce everything that stands in the way of following Him, even our possessions and sometimes even relationships. Jesus calls us to carry our cross with courage and trust. These words are not easy to hear, but they remind us that discipleship is not comfortable. It is demanding, costly, and yet deeply life-giving. This month of September is traditionally devoted to Our Lady of Sorrows. Mary, the Mother of God, knew what it meant to carry the cross. She did not carry the wood of

Calvary, but she bore in her heart the anguish of watching her Son suffer and die. The Church honors her especially under this title because she teaches us how to remain faithful in the face of suffering, grief, and loss. Mary stood at the foot of the Cross, when others fled. She teaches us to unite our sorrows with Christ's saving sacrifice. Last week our hearts have been pierced with sorrow after the tragic shooting at the Annunciation Catholic School and Church in Minneapolis. Children, parents, teachers and an entire faith community have been devastated by violence and evil that never should have touched a place of faith and learning. We mourn with them, we pray for the souls of the departed, for healing of the injured, and for the consolation of families who grieve and are suffering. It is almost impossible to comprehend such pain. And yet, at the Cross, Mary reminds us that God does not abandon His people in their darkest hour. Mary's title, Our Lady of Sorrows, is not only about her pain, but about her strength. She did not turn away from God when tragedy struck. Instead, she kept her eyes on her Son, Jesus. In the same way, when we face evil and suffering in our world, we are called not to despair, but to draw even closer to the Lord. Mary models for us how to hold onto faith when the world seems to fall apart. The

Gospel today asks us to count the cost of discipleship. Following Jesus will mean carrying the cross, and sometimes that cross looks like grief, like violence and unexpected pain in our lives and communities, like tragedies that shake our sense of security. But discipleship also means hope and eternal life. It means that even when we stand at the foot of the cross, we know resurrection will come. Life will overcome death. So how do we respond to these sorrows as Christians? First, with prayer. We commend the victims and their families to God's mercy. Second, with compassion. We support and walk with those who mourn and are praying for healing of a loved one, so they do not carry their cross alone. Third, with courage and hope. We commit ourselves anew to building a world where every child is safe, where peace overcomes hatred, and where love is stronger than fear. Our Lady of Sorrows stands with us today. She embraces the children and families of Annunciation School and Church, with her motherly heart, just as she embraced her Son at Calvary. Let us turn to Our Blessed Mother and ask her to intercede for us, that we may be people of faith, people of hope, and people of love even in the face of sorrow. May Mary, Our Lady of Sorrows, lead us always to her Son. May we find the strength to carry our crosses with Him. And may we look forward with confidence to the day when sorrow will be no more, and God will wipe away every tear from our eyes.
