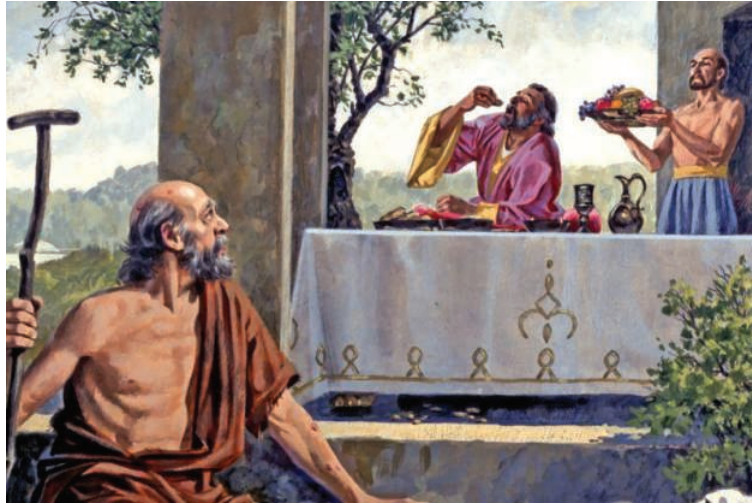

Dear St. Philip Neri Friends and Family,

We give praise and thanks to God for the graces and blessings He has given us! Today's Gospel from Luke tells the story of the rich man and Lazarus. It is a powerful and sobering parable. The rich man lives in luxury, dressed in fine clothes and enjoying great feasts. At his very doorstep lies Lazarus, poor, hungry, and covered with sores. The rich man never lifts a hand to help him. When both men die, the tables are turned. Lazarus is comforted in the bosom of Abraham, while the rich man suffers torment. This parable is not simply about wealth and poverty. It is about the danger of blindness and indifference.

The rich man did not hurt Lazarus directly, but he also never noticed him, never offered food. Never gave comfort. His sin was that he closed his heart to the suffering right in front of him. The Gospel is reminding us that discipleship requires not only avoiding evil, but actively choosing compassion, mercy, and generosity. The prophet Amos in our first reading also warns against those who grow comfortable and complacent, lying on ivory couches, enjoying music and wine, while ignoring the collapse of their nation around them. God does not condemn comfort itself, but He condemns a life that is insulated from others, a life that turns away from responsibility toward the suffering and the vulnerable. This parable speaks strongly to our own time. There is great poverty in our world, not only material poverty, but also poverty of spirit, loneliness, grief, and despair. Lazarus is still at our gates today. He may be the immigrant seeking welcome, the single parent trying to provide for children or the elderly neighbor who feels forgotten. The Gospel challenges us to open our eyes and our hearts, to see the person in need, and to act with love. As we reach the end of September, the Church also concludes the month traditionally dedicated to Our Lady of Sorrows, shows us what it means to have a heart that notices and cares. She did not look away from suffering of her Son on the Cross. She stood with Him, and she shared in His pain. Mary did not run from sorrow but embraced it with love and faith. In her example, we see the opposite of the rich man's blindness. She saw, she stayed, and she suffered with love. Our Lady of Sorrows teaches us that to be Christian is to have a compassionate heart. It is to be willing to draw near to those who suffer, not to turn away. So, as this month dedicated to Our Lady of Sorrows comes to a close, let us ask her to give us eyes to see the Lazarus at the door, hearts to respond with mercy, and the courage to live out the compassion of her Son. May Our Lady of Sorrows, who stood faithfully at the foot of the Cross, intercede for us and guide us always closer to her Son, Jesus Christ.

Baptism

Baptisms are scheduled on the 2nd & 4th Sunday of every month immediately following the 11AM Mass. Godparents need Letters of Eligibility, for first time parents the Pre-Jordan Class is required. Call the Church Office at 610-834-1975 to make arrangements.

Marriage

Arrangements must be made with a priest at least 6 months prior to wedding date. Pre-Cana classes are required, contact Church office at 610-834-1975.

Anointing of the Sick

Primarily intended as prayers and anointing for healing from serious illness or as a spiritual preparation before surgery. Last Rites or Extreme Unction are for those in danger of imminent death. Call rectory or Church Office.

How Do I Witness the Faith?

The duty of the laity "...does not consist only in the witness of one's way of life; a true apostle looks for opportunities to announce Christ by words addressed either to non-believers with a view to leading them to faith, or to the faithful with a view to instructing, strengthening, and encouraging them to a more fervent life." -Apostolicam Actuositatem

So, witnessing one's way of life is not sufficient. All the laity have a special obligation to announce Christ by words to non-believers and to the faithful. That is required of all the laity.

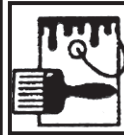
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
