Dear St. Philip Neri Friends and Family,

We give praise and thanks to God for the graces and blessings He has given us! The disciples in today's Gospel approach Jesus with a very simple request: "Increase our faith." They realize that faith is the foundation of discipleship. Without faith, the demands of the Gospel seem overwhelming. With faith, however small, all things are possible. Jesus responds by telling them that even faith the size of a mustard seed can move mountains, can uproot a mulberry tree and plant it in the sea. He is teaching us that it is not the size of our faith that matters most, but the presence of faith itself, rooted in God's power and love. In our own lives, we may sometimes feel like the disciples, aware of how small our faith seems. We struggle with prayer, with doubts, with moments when God feels distant. Yet Jesus reminds us that even the smallest seed of faith, when nurtured, can grow into something extraordinary. God is the one who makes faith fruitful. Our part is to trust, to persevere, and to allow His grace to work in us. The second part of the Gospel reminds us that discipleship is not about earning rewards or seeking recognition. We are servants of the Lord, called to do His will out of love. When we live faithfully, when we obey God's commands, when we persevere in prayer, we are simply living as we should. Our lives become an offering of love to the One who has given us everything. As we begin the month of October, the Church turns our attention to Our Lady of the Rosary. October is traditionally dedicated to the Rosary, that beautiful prayer which has been called a "compendium of the Gospel." In the rosary, we meditate on the mysteries of Christ's life, death, and resurrection through the eyes of Mary. We learn from her how to ponder God's works with faith, patience, and love. The Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary on October 7th has its origins in history. In 1571, when Christian Europe faced the threat on invasion, the faithful turned to the Rosary for protection. Pope Pius V asked all of Christendom to pray, and the Christian fleet won a decisive victory at the Battle of Lepanto. This victory was credited to the intercession of Our Lady through the Rosary. For this reason, the feast was established as a reminder of the power of prayer, especially the Rosary, in times of trial. The Rosary remains a powerful weapon, not of destruction, but of peace. It strengthens our faith, it draws us closer to Christ, and it gives us hope. Each Hail Mary is like a seed of faith planted in our hearts, a seed that God can make grow into something far greater than we imagine. This week, as we celebrate the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary, let us make a renewed commitment to this prayer. Perhaps we can pray a decade each day with our family, or take time to pray the Rosary while driving, walking, or resting. In this way, we not only honor Mary, but we allow her to lead us more deeply into the mysteries of Christ. Brothers and sisters, like the disciples, let us ask the Lord to increase our faith. Let us not be discouraged by how small our faith may feel, but let us entrust it to God, who makes all things grow. And let us take up the Rosary as a school of faith, a prayer that strengthens us for the battles we face, and a chain that binds us ever closer to Christ through the heart of His Mother. May Our Lady of the Rosary, intercede for us, may our faith grow strong, and may our lives reflect the love and hope of Christ to a world in need.

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Baptism

Marriage

Arrangements must be made with a priest at least 6 months prior to wedding date. Pre-Cana classes are required, contact Church office at 610-834-1975.

Anointing of the Sick

Primarily intended as prayers and anointing for healing from serious illness or as a spiritual preparation before surgery. Last Rites or Extreme Unction are for those in danger of imminent death. Call rectory or Church Office.

How Do I Witness the Faith?

The duty of the laity "...does not consist only in the witness of one's way of life; a true apostle looks for opportunities to announce Christ by words addressed either to non-believers with a view to leading them to faith, or to the faithful with a view to instructing, strengthening, and encouraging them to a more fervent life." -Apostolicam Actuositatem

So, witnessing one's way of life is not sufficient. All the laity have a special obligation to announce Christ by words to non-believers and to the faithful. That is required of all the laity.

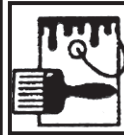
