Dear St. Philip Neri Friends and Family,

We give praise and thanks to God for the graces and blessings He has given us! Today's Gospel presents us with one of the most striking contrasts in all of Scripture: the prayer of the Pharisee and the prayer of the tax collector. Both men enter the Temple to pray. The Pharisee stands tall and thanks God, but his words are filled with pride. He compares himself to others and boasts of his fasting and tithing. The tax collector, on the other hand, remains in the back, unable even to lift his eyes. He simply prays, "O God, be merciful to me, a sinner." Jesus makes it clear who went home justified. It was not the one who appeared righteous, but the one who was humble before God. The lesson is unmistakable. Prayer is not about impressing others or presenting ourselves as perfect. Prayer is about coming before God with honesty and humility. God does not want our self-importance; He wants our hearts. The Pharisee's prayer teaches us the danger of spiritual pride. He was so busy comparing himself to others that he could not see his own need for God's mercy. The tax collector, on the other hand, knew he was a sinner, and in that recognition, he opened himself to God's grace. The saints remind us again and again that humility is the foundation of holiness. St. Augustine once said that the first step to God is humility, the second is humility, and the third is humility. Without humility, we cannot recognize our need for God. With humility, we open ourselves to His transforming love. The first reading from Sirach echoes this truth. God shows no partiality, but He listens especially to the cry of the poor, of the oppressed, the orphan, and the widow. He hears the prayer of the humble. This is a great comfort for us. It means that no matter our status, no matter our failures, no matter how small we feel in the world's eyes, God sees us, God loves us, and God hears our prayer. St. Paul, in the second reading, gives us a personal testimony of this truth. He writes near the end of his life, looking back on his trials and proclaiming that he has fought the good fight and kept the faith. He recognizes that it was not his own strength that carried him through, but the Lord who stood by him and gave him power. Paul shows us what humility looks like in action; not denying our efforts, but recognizing that everything we accomplish is by God's grace. The Gospel challenges us to look honestly at our own prayer. Do we sometimes fall into the trap of the Pharisee, comparing ourselves to others, trying to justify ourselves, or thinking we do not need God's mercy? Or do we come before the Lord like the tax collector, honest, humble, and ready to receive? True prayer begins when we set aside appearances and simply open our hearts to God. As we come to the end of October, the month of the Holy Rosary, it is fitting to remember that Mary, Our Lady of the Rosary, is the model of humility. At the Annunciation she said, "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord." Her greatness came not from pride, but from her willingness to serve. Every time we pray the Rosary, we are invited to look at Christ's life through her eyes, to learn her humility, and to grow in trust. Brothers and sisters, let us learn from today's readings. Let us put aside pride and pray with humble hearts. Let us never compare ourselves to others, but instead compare ourselves to Christ, who humbled Himself on the Cross for our salvation. Let us turn to Our Lady, asking her to teach us humility, so that like the tax collector we may pray, "O God, be merciful to me, a sinner", and like St. Paul, we may say at the end of our lives, "the Lord has stood by me and given me strength."

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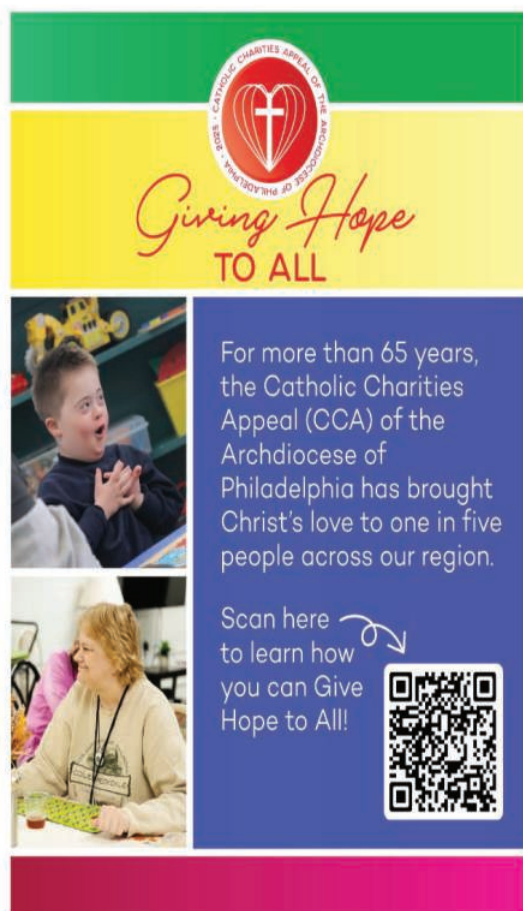

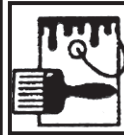
We would like to express deep gratitude to St.
