Dear St. Philip Neri Friends and Family,

We give praise and thanks to God for the graces and blessings He has given us! Today we celebrate the final Sunday of the liturgical year by proclaiming one of the most important truths of our faith: Jesus Christ is King. He is King not only of heaven, but of our world, our Church, our families, and our hearts. Yet the kingship of Christ looks very different from the kings of this world. He does not rule from a palace adorned with gold. He rules from the Cross. In today's Gospel, Jesus is mocked by soldiers and by those standing beneath the Cross. They say, "If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself." Yet Jesus shows His kingship is not about power and dominion. It is about sacrificial love. It is about self-gift. It is about mercy poured out for the salvation of all. On the Cross, Christ reveals the true meaning of kingship: to serve, to save, and to give His life so that we all have eternal life. The good thief crucified beside Jesus over time recognizes this. He sees not a defeated man, but a loving Divine King whose Kingdom cannot be destroyed. He asks, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your Kingdom." Jesus responds with the most royal of promises: "Today you will be with me in Paradise." This moment reminds us that Christ's Kingdom is near to all who call on Him with humility, trust, and repentance. The first reading from Second Samuel shows how Israel longed for a shepherd king, one who would both guide and protect them. Jesus is the fulfillment of this promise. He is not a distant ruler. He knows each of His sheep by name. He seeks out the lost. He heals the wounded. He carries us when we are weak. St. Paul, in the second reading, gives us a breathtaking vision of Christ's kingship. He is the image of the invisible God. All things were created through Him and for Him. He is before all things, and in Him all things hold together. Paul reminds us that Christ's authority spans the entire universe. Yet this cosmic King chose the Cross. He chose us. He chose love. As this liturgical year concludes, the Solemnity of Christ the King invites us to reflect: Who rules our hearts? Do we allow Christ to be King of our choices, our families, our priorities? Or do other things compete for His place: fear, pride, possessions, comfort? To honor Christ the King means surrendering our lives to Him, trusting His mercy, and following Him even when the path leads to sacrifice. This feast also reminds us that salvation history is not random. The world is not spinning out of control. Christ reigns, even when we see chaos or suffering. His Kingdom is already begun, and it will one day be complete. At the end of time, every tear will be wiped away and every heart will recognize the king of Glory. Next week, we begin Advent, a new liturgical year and a new season of hope. We prepare once again to welcome Christ the King, who comes to us not in royal robes but as a child in a manger. Advent reminds us that the King who will come again in glory is the same King who came in humility to dwell with us. Brothers and sisters, let us proclaim with joy that Jesus Christ is our King. Let us place our lives under His lordship. Let us serve Him by loving others generously. Let us look forward with hope to the day when His Kingdom will be fully revealed and we will live with Him forever. To Christ our King be glory and honor, now and forever.

MEMORIAL CHRISTMAS LANTERNS

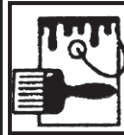
