Dear St. Philip Neri Friends and Family,

We give praise and thanks to God for the graces and blessings He has given us! Today, Holy Mother Church invites us to rejoice as we celebrate the Third Sunday of Advent, traditionally known as Gaudete Sunday. The word “gaudete” means “rejoice” taken from St. Paul’s powerful encouragement in the second reading; “Rejoice in the Lord always. I shall say it again, rejoice” The rose-colored candle and vestments symbolize a shift in the season. We are still waiting, still preparing, but now we are closer. The Lord is near. Advent joy is not the same as seasonal cheerfulness. It is not dependent on perfect holidays or stress-free days. Advent joy is deeper. It springs from the conviction that God is faithful, that He keeps His promises, and that He is drawing close to His people. Even in difficulty, even in uncertainty, even in grief, the nearness of the Lord gives us reason to rejoice. In today’s Gospel, the crowds come to John the Baptist with a sincere question; “What should we do?” They are moved by his preaching and want to prepare for the Messiah in a real, concrete way. John answers by directing them to simple acts of love and integrity. Share with those who have less. Be honest and fair in your work. Avoid exploiting or mistreating others. Holiness is not found in extraordinary moments. It is woven into the ordinary tasks and daily choices of life. Preparing for Christ begins with the humble work of living with Christian virtue. John also announces the source of our Advent joy. Someone greater is coming. John is not the Messiah; he is the voice pointing toward Jesus. The one who is coming will baptize with the Holy Spirit and fire. He will bring justice, mercy, and salvation. Our joy grows from the certainty that Christ is on His way, entering the world and entering our lives with love, mercy, strength and compassion. The first reading from the prophet Zephaniah echoes this joy. It imagines a God who rejoices over His people with singing and renews them with His love, this is a beautiful and comforting image. God not only comes to us. He delights in us. He desires to lift our burdens and to fill our hearts with peace. St. Paul continues this message in his letter to the Philippians. He encourages us to rejoice, to live with kindness, and to trust instead of giving in to anxiety. Why? Because “the Lord is near.” The nearness changes everything. When we remember that God is close to us, present in our struggles and guiding our steps, our hearts find a joy and peace that the world cannot give and cannot take away. As we enter the second half of Advent, the Church invites each of us to ask the same question the crowd asked John; What should we do? What needs to change in my heart before Christmas comes? What needs healing? What needs forgiveness? What needs to be let go? We prepare for Christmas not only by decorating our homes but by preparing a place in our hearts for Christ to dwell. John the Baptist reminds us that preparation begins with integrity, generosity, and compassion. It begins when we turn toward God and allow Him to renew us. Advent is the season when God invites us to begin again, to hope again, and to rejoice again. Brothers and sisters, rejoice today not because everything is perfect, but because God is faithful. Rejoice because the Lord is near. Rejoice because Christ is coming to bring healing, mercy, and peace.

Please invite someone to Mass today.

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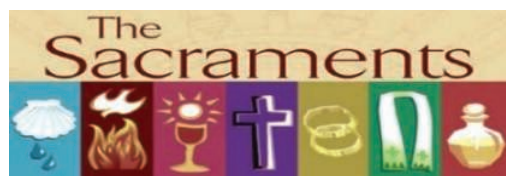

Baptism

Baptisms are scheduled on the 2nd & 4th Sunday of every month immediately following the 11AM Mass. Godparents need Letters of Eligibility, for first time parents the Pre-Jordan Class is required. Call the Church Office at 610-834-1975 to make arrangements.

Marriage

Arrangements must be made with a priest at least 6 months prior to wedding date. Pre-Cana classes are required, contact Church office at 610-834-1975.

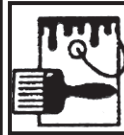
