Dancers from The Pennsylvania Ballet spent a day at SPN. The children had an opportunity to ask questions and stop by to observe while, at the end of the day, a more formal assembly was held where their true talents were showcased. The program was presented at no cost to SPN, courtesy of The Pennsylvania Ballet. It is through the efforts of a very dedicated parent volunteer that St. Philip's and its students are able to be exposed to such wonderful assemblies throughout the school year. Our second grade students and parishioners made First Penance early in February. Please keep all of these children in your prayers as they continue to work hard toward the Sacrament of First Communion this spring. St. Philip's hosted its annual spelling bee in February. "E-L-O-Q-U-E-N-C-E" was the final, correctly spelled word that determined our 8th grade winner this year. Second and third place went to a 6th grader and a 5th grader, respectively. Between Trivia Night, our annual hoagie sale, and the Father/Daughter dance, St. Philip's fund raisers were, again, a huge success. Many thanks to the parent volunteers who help to make these so successful! Trivia night was sold out, many hoagies were made, sold, and eaten, and the dance floor was packed as dads and daughters danced their night away. The students took part in The Math-A-Thon for St. Jude's Children's Research Hospital. This is a program that encourages and creates interest in math while, at the same time, raises funds to continue with cancer research. The kids also spent time raising money for a classmate who suffers from Cartilage-Hair Hypoplasia or CHH. 7th graders sold buttons with her picture along w/purple ribbons with all proceeds going directly to The Ronald McDonald House in her name. Please keep her in your prayers as she continues on her journey towards good health. St. Philip's student council started a Student of the Month program. This award is chosen by the student council members and is awarded to the student who exceeds either spiritually, academically, and/or athletically. Teachers submit a student candidate from their homeroom, each month, who she feels exemplifies one or more of these characteristics. This is a great way to acknowledge students who go above and beyond both in and out of the classroom. 8th grade's field trip to the Montgomery County Courthouse was a visit to learn more about the United States Justice System while serving as a perfect complement to their assigned reading. To Kill a Mockingbird. The class visited court rooms, sat in on trials, talked w/judges, and visited the "bull pen" where inmates are kept as they await trial. As a follow up, one of our parents who works as an attorney, spoke to the class and explained the process in further detail. Then it was the kid's turn. They presented a mock trial using all that they've learned through reading, observing, and listening. We also fulfilled nutritional goals outlined by our Wellness Program. Knowing the most important meal of the day, breakfast was served during our week of standardized testing. Many students showed up to "Fuel Up For Success" prior to taking their TerraNova exams. We also held our annual St. Patrick's Day "Go for the Greens" which allows the students to taste all sorts of green fruits and veggies at lunch. There is also a new program called Girls on the Run. Thanks to one of our faculty members and a dedicated parent volunteer, the girls are learning a whole lot about exercising smart while training for a 5k event. This weekend SPN's theatre company performs an original production, Once In A Blue Moon.
