
The Samaritians were a group of people who lived in Samaria, an area north of Jerusalem. They were half-Jews and half-Gentiles. After the Assyrian captivity of the region in the 7th century BC, some of the Jewish people intermingled with the Assyrians (who adopted the religion of Yahweh) and a new race developed. Looked upon by Israel as traitors to the faith and little better than Gentiles, they had their own temple in Samaria, their own unique canon of Scripture and a unique system of worship. Because of their imperfect adherence to Judaism and their pagan ancestry they were despised by the Jewish people. In making a Samaritan the moral hero of today's Gospel, Jesus asks His listeners to find nobility in a group of people despised by society. The Samaritan ignored both religious and racial barriers and recognized the injured man as his neighbor.
