

Dear St. Philip Neri Families & Friends

We give praise and thanks to God for the graces He has given us. I want to give you a heads up for next Sunday when you enter our Church you will notice that our crucifix and statues will be veiled. It may seem strange that during the most sacred time of the year you would enter the Church and see our beautiful crucifix and statues veiled? Should not we be looking at the painful scene of Calvary while we listen to the Passion Narratives on Palm Sunday, as we enter the Passontide of Christ? While it may appear counterintuitive to veil statues and images during the final weeks of Holy Lent, the Catholic Church recommends this practice to highlight our senses and build within us the longing for Easter Sunday. It is a tradition that should not only be carried out in our Church, but can also be a fruitful activity for the “domestic church” to practice. The practice goes back to the Middle Ages. Some theologians in the Church saw the practice as a symbolic way Jesus veiled His divinity for our sake during His passion, others relate it to John’s Gospel when Jesus hid Himself amongst the crowds in the Temple area from the pharisees and the priests, who were trying to entrap Him. We use veils to alert us of the special season of Holy Lent that we are in. We walk into Church and notice everything is covered; we immediately know that something is different. The last two weeks of Lent are called the Passontide and are meant to be a time of immediate preparation for the Sacred Triduum, these veils focus our attention on the words being prayed at Mass. When we listen to the Passion Narrative, our senses are allowed to focus on the striking words from the Gospel and truly enter into the scenes with Christ. The Church uses veils to produce a heightened sense of anticipation for the Resurrection of our Lord. This is further actualized when you attend Mass and see the veils each day. You do not want them to be there, because they are hiding some beautiful images. Therein lies the whole point: the veils are not meant to be there forever. The images need to be unveiled; it is unnatural for them to be covered. The unveiling before Easter is a great reminder of our own life on earth. We live in a “veiled” world, in exile from our true home. It is only through uniting ourselves to the Passion and Resurrection of Christ that the veil is lifted and we are finally able to see the beauty of everything in our lives.

Anointing of the Sick

Primarily intended as prayers for healing from serious illness or as a spiritual preparation before surgery, it can involve multiple sacraments; Penance, Anointing & Eucharist. When death is imminent, it serves as "Last Rites" which include a special Apostolic Pardon. Please do not delay in calling for your elderly or chronically ill family member.

Call the Church Office to schedule an anointing.



Sacrament of Baptism

Baptisms are scheduled for the 2nd & 4th Sunday of every month immediately following the 11:30AM Mass. For first time parents, Pre-Jordan classes are required. Deacon Mike Cipressi conducts these classes via zoom appointments, they are offered on the 2nd Monday of the month. Godparents are required to obtain Letters of Eligibility; these letters are due at the Parish Office at least one week before the scheduled baptismal date. Call the Church Office at 610-834-1975 to schedule a Baptism and/or to register for the Pre-Jordan Class.



Sacrament of Marriage

Arrangements must be made with a priest at least 6 months prior to your desired wedding date. A Pre-Cana Class is required and held here at St. Philip's twice per year, usually in the spring and again in the fall. Please call the Church Office at 610-834-1975 to schedule a meeting with a priest and to obtain information on the Pre-Cana Class. Liturgy and musical planning are done through Mrs. Jean Martin our Director of Music (215-704-0508).

Fast & Abstinence

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting & abstinence for Catholics. Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence. Fasting is obligatory from age 18 until age 59. One full meal is permitted as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. Abstinence from meat is binding on those 14 years old and older. Obviously if health issues require a routine daily diet, you are not under obligation.


