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Dear St. Philip Neri Families & Friends

We give praise and thanks to God for the graces He has given us. Today, in the Gospel reading from Matthew, Jesus' words may seem challenging and demanding, but they hold within them a profound message of love and discipleship. Let us reflect on them together and find inspiration for our own journey of faith. In these verses, Jesus says, "Whoever loves father and mother more than me is not worthy of me, and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me." These words may seem unsettling at first, as we cherish the love and bonds we share with our families. However, Jesus is not advocating for a rejection of familial love, but rather emphasizing the primacy of our love for Him. Our love for God must surpass any other affection, even the closest and most cherished relationships in our lives. It is through our love for Christ that our love for others is purified and strengthened. Furthermore, Jesus speaks of taking up our crosses and following Him. As Catholics, we are intimately familiar with the symbol of the cross, for it is at the heart of our faith. Our Lord's words remind us that discipleship involves embracing the cross, and willingly sharing in the sufferings and challenges that accompany our commitment to Christ. Our struggles become a path to union with Him, a way to participate in His redemptive work. In embracing our crosses, we become His disciples, walking in His footsteps and witnessing to His love and mercy. In the closing verses of the passage, Jesus assures us that even the smallest acts of kindness and hospitality do not go unnoticed in His eyes. He says, "and whoever gives only a cup of cold water to one of these little ones to drink because the little one is a disciple - amen, I say to you, he will surely not lose his reward." These words remind us of the profound value of even the simplest acts of charity. Our faith is not solely about grand gestures or extraordinary feats; it is about the daily choices we make to love and serve others. Every act of compassion, no matter how small, is an opportunity to encounter Christ and bring His love into the world. As we reflect on these words of Jesus, let us examine the depth of our commitment to Him. Are we willing to put Christ above all else, even our closest relationships? Are we prepared to take up our cross and follow Him, trusting in His grace to sustain us? And are we actively seeking opportunities to serve and show kindness to others, recognizing that in doing so, we serve our Lord Himself? Our Catholic Faith calls us to a radical discipleship, a discipleship that demands our wholehearted surrender to Christ. May we love God above all things, seeking to deepen our relationship with Him each day. May we embrace the cross, finding strength and consolation in the redemptive power of Christ's sacrifice. And may we imitate Jesus, who came not to be served but to serve, by extending love, mercy, and hospitality to all those we encounter.

Anointing of the Sick

Primarily intended as prayers for healing from serious illness or as a spiritual preparation before surgery, it can involve multiple sacraments; Penance, Anointing & Eucharist. When death is imminent, it serves as "Last Rites" which include a special Apostolic Pardon. Please do not delay in calling for your elderly or chronically ill family member. Call the Church Office to schedule an anointing.



Sacrament of Baptism

Baptisms are scheduled for the 2nd & 4th Sunday of every month immediately following the 11AM Mass. For first time parents, Pre-Jordan classes are required. Deacon Mike Cipressi conducts these classes via zoom appointments, they are offered on the 2nd Monday of the month. Godparents are required to obtain Letters of Eligibility; these letters are due at the Parish Office at least one week before the scheduled baptismal date. Call the Church Office at 610-834-1975 to schedule a Baptism and/or to register for the Pre-Jordan Class.



Sacrament of Marriage

Arrangements must be made with a priest at least 6 months prior to your desired wedding date. A Pre-Cana Class is required and held here at St. Philip's twice per year, usually in the spring and again in the fall. Please call the Church Office at 610-834-1975 to schedule a meeting with a priest and to obtain information on the Pre-Cana Class. Spiritual Adoption Update

Your baby is quite active in the womb now...although the mother won't feel him for another couple of months. If his mother's womb had a window, you could watch your spiritually adopted baby squint, swallow and move his tongue. He can make a tight fist if you touch his palm. He is breathing amniotic fluid which continues until birth, although he obtains oxygen his body needs through the umbilical cord. The baby you are praying for weighs one ounce. Early this month, at just 9 weeks, he began to suck his thumb.

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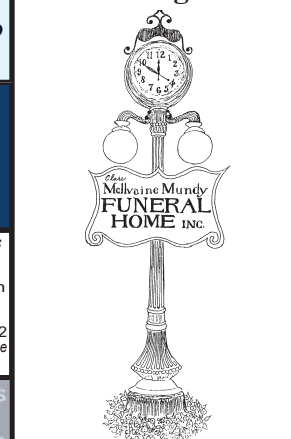
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
