Dear St. Philip Neri Families & Friends

Today's Gospel passage invites us to explore the profound wisdom and understanding that can be found in the Kingdom of Heaven. Jesus presents to us a series of parables, using ordinary earthly examples to reveal the extraordinary treasures that await those who seek the Kingdom. Additionally, our Old Testament reading from the Book of 1st Kings sheds light on the importance of seeking wisdom above all else. The parables that Jesus shares with us in the Gospel of Matthew are like valuable jewels, precious gifts from the Divine Master Himself. In today's Gospel, we encounter three parables; the Hidden Treasure, the Pearl of Great Price, and the Fishing Net.

Each parable carries a profound message, urging us to understand the true worth of the Kingdom of Heaven. In the first parable, Jesus speaks of a man who discovers a hidden treasure buried in a field. Filled with joy, he sells everything he has to buy that field and possess the treasure.

This teaches us the importance of recognizing the immeasurable value of the Kingdom of Heaven. When we encounter God's love and grace, we should be willing to let go of everything that hinders us from fully embracing it.

Likewise, the second parable speaks of a merchant searching for fine pearls. Upon finding one of great value, he too sells all he has to possess it. This pearl of great price signifies the depth of God's love, which surpasses all other desires and pursuits in life. When we truly encounter God's love, we realize that nothing in this world can compare to the joy and fulfillment it brings. In the final parable, Jesus tells us about the fishing net thrown into the sea, catching fish of every kind. This net represents the gathering of all people into God's Kingdom. However, it also reminds us that there will be a judgement day when the good and the wicked will be separated. Now, let us turn to our Old

Testament reading from 1st Kings. We find ourselves in the presence of King Solomon, the son of David, who is renowned for his wisdom. In a dream, the Lord appeared to Solomon and asked him, "Ask for whatever you want me to give you." Instead of asking for wealth, power, or fame, Solomon humbly requests wisdom to govern God's people justly. Solomon's request for wisdom demonstrates his

recognition of the Kingdom's values and the responsibilities that come with leadership. God granted his humble request and bestowed upon him unparalleled wisdom, making him an example of righteous rule and a source of inspiration for us. In merging these readings, we are reminded of the call to seek the wisdom of the Kingdom of Heaven above all else. The Kingdom is like the hidden treasure, waiting for us to discover its worth and embrace it with joy. The pearl of great price is the love and grace of God, which we must cherish and pursue with all our hearts. As disciples of Christ and as a faith community,

we are called to emulate Solomon's humility and recognize that true wisdom comes from God alone. When we seek

His guidance and make decisions in line with His teachings, we pave the way for a just and righteous society that reflects the values of the Kingdom of Heaven. Brothers and sisters, let us begin this new week with a renewed sense of purpose and a desire to seek the Kingdom of Heaven with all our hearts. May we recognize the immense value of God's love and grace, and may His wisdom guide us in all our endeavors. Let us strive to be like the merchant in the Gospel, willing to sacrifice everything for the sake of God's Kingdom. As we journey through life, may the hidden treasure of God's Kingdom fill us with immeasurable joy and inspire us to share this precious gift with others.

Anointing of the Sick

Primarily intended as prayers for healing from serious illness or as a spiritual preparation before surgery, it can involve multiple sacraments; Penance, Anointing & Eucharist. When death is imminent, it serves as "Last Rites" which include a special Apostolic Pardon. Please do not delay in calling for your elderly or chronically ill family member.

Sacrament of Baptism

Baptisms are scheduled for the 2nd & 4th Sunday of every month immediately following the 11AM Mass. For first time parents, Pre-Jordan classes are required. Deacon Mike Cipressi conducts these classes via zoom appointments, they are offered on the 2nd Monday of the month. Godparents are required to obtain Letters of Eligibility; these letters are due at the Parish Office at least one week before the scheduled baptismal date. Call the Church Office at 610-834-1975 to schedule a Baptism and/or to register for the Pre-Jordan Class.



Sacrament of Marriage

Arrangements must be made with a priest at least 6 months prior to your desired wedding date, contact the Church Office at 610-834-1975 to schedule. The Archdiocese requires that couples attend a Pre-Cana class before marriage. At this time, we ask you to go to www.archphila.org, under marriage preparations to take class on line.
