

Dear St. Philip Neri Families & Friends

We give praise and thanks to God for the graces He has given us. In the Gospel of Matthew, we encounter a pivotal moment in the life of Jesus and His disciples that sheds light on the profound nature of faith, authority, and the Church.

This passage, Matthew 16:13-20, often referred to as the “Confession of Peter”, captures a conversation that took place between Jesus and His disciples in the region of Caesarea Philippi. Jesus and His disciples are amidst the backdrop of a place with significant pagan influence. Against this backdrop,

Jesus poses a critical question to His disciples: “Who do people say that the Son of Man is?” (MT 16:13). The disciples respond, revealing various opinions circulating among the people. But then, Jesus turns the question directly to them: “But who do you say that I am?” (MT 16:15). It’s Simon Peter who, inspired by the Holy Spirit, boldly declares, “You are the Christ, the Son of the living God.” (MT 16:16).

In this declaration, Peter acknowledges Jesus’ divine identity and the fulfillment of the Messianic prophecy. This confession marks a turning point, for it’s not a mere acknowledgement of Jesus as a great teacher or prophet, but a profound recognition of His true nature as God, the Anointed One, the Savior of the world. Jesus responds to Peter’s confession with words that have echoed throughout history: “Blessed are you, Simon Bar-

Jonah! For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my Father who is in heaven. And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock, I will build my Church, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven” (MT 16:17-19). In this declaration, Jesus plays on words, transforming Simon’s name (meaning “rock”) into Peter, which also means “rock”. The rock upon which Christ will build His Church is the truth of Peter’s confession—the divinity of Jesus Christ. Here, we find a promise of the Church’s endurance against all adversities, symbolized by the “gates of hell”. Furthermore, Jesus entrusts Peter with the keys of the kingdom, endowing Him with authority—a theme that continues through apostolic succession. This passage invites us to reflect on the nature of our own faith. Are we like the

disciples, influenced by popular opinions and human ideas about who Jesus is? Or are we like Peter, guided by the revelation of the Father to recognize Jesus as the Christ, the Son of the living God? Additionally, the passage reminds us of the significance of the Church as being established by Christ

Himself. It is not merely a human institution, but a divine foundation, sustained by the truth of Peter’s confession and empowered by the Holy Spirit. The authority and responsibility entrusted to Peter also extend to the apostolic succession, emphasizing the continuity of leadership within the Church. As we contemplate this passage, let us renew our commitment to understand and embrace the profound reality of Jesus Christ as the Son of God and the Savior of the world.

Let us also cherish the gift of the Church, recognizing its divine origin and mission to bring the message of salvation to all corners of the earth. Just as Peter’s confession changed the course of his life, may our recognition of Jesus’ divinity transform our hearts and actions, leading us to live as faithful disciples within the enduring Church.

Arrangements must be made with a priest at least 6 months prior to your desired wedding date, contact the Church Office at 610-834-1975 to schedule. The Archdiocese requires that couples attend a Pre-Cana class before marriage. At this time, we ask you to go to www.archphila.org, under marriage preparations. Liturgy and musical planning are done through Mrs. Jean Martin our Director of Music (215-704-0508).



Anointing of the Sick

Primarily intended as prayers for healing from serious illness or as a spiritual preparation before surgery, it can involve multiple sacraments; Penance, Anointing & Eucharist. When death is imminent, it serves as "Last Rites" which include a special Apostolic Pardon. Please do not delay in calling for your elderly or chronically ill family member. Call the Church Office to schedule an anointing.



Sacrament of Baptism

Baptisms are scheduled for the 2nd & 4th Sunday of every month immediately following the 11AM Mass. For first time parents, Pre-Jordan classes are required. Deacon Mike Cipressi conducts these classes via zoom appointments, they are offered on the 2nd Monday of the month. Godparents are required to obtain Letters of Eligibility; these letters are due at the Parish Office at least one week before the scheduled baptismal date. Call the Church Office at 610-834-1975 to schedule a Baptism and/or to register for the Pre-Jordan Class.



Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is for individuals interested in exploring and discerning membership in the Catholic Church. This program is for non-Catholics who may or may not have been baptized in another Christian Church and wish to receive the Sacraments of Penance, Confirmation and Holy Eucharist.
