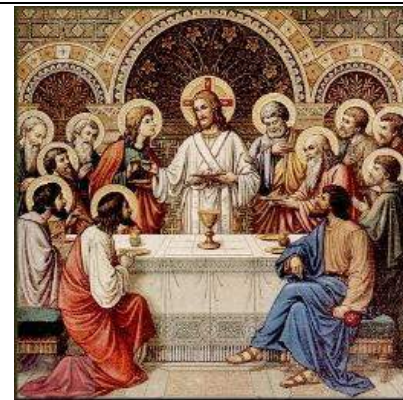

Dear St. Philip Neri Families & Friends



We give praise and thanks to God for the graces He has given us. As we continue on our journey during the Holy Lent, I would like to continue with reflections from our **No Greater Love** class with Dr. Edward Sri. **Mocking Jesus** – the Gospels report how Jesus suffers at this moment both physical and personal abuse from the chief priests, scribes, and elders. They spit on Him, strike Him, slap Him, beat Him, and cover His face, blindfolding Him and saying, “Prophecy to us, you Christ. Who is it that struck you?” (Matthew 26:67-68; see also Mark 14:65; Luke 22:63-65). Spitting on someone was an act of contempt (see Job 30:9-10), and the punishment for those considered guilty (see Numbers 12:14; Deuteronomy 25:9). Jesus being slapped and spit at fulfills what was prophesied about the suffering servant who would save Israel; “I gave my cheeks to slaps...I hid not my face from shame and spitting” (Isaiah 50:6). This brings to its climax one central theme throughout this scene: the irony of this mock trial. How ironic it is that the Sanhedrin pass judgement on the One who will judge them and all of humanity on the last day. They accuse Jesus of breaking the law when they are the ones who disobey the Law of Moses by seeking false witness and by their high priest tearing his garments. They accuse Jesus of blasphemy for speaking the truth about His divine identity and in the process blaspheme the holy Son of God. They blindfold Jesus so that He cannot see and mock Him for being a false prophet, yet they are the ones who cannot see. They fail to see how in their own mocking of Christ, they unwittingly play a part in His fulfilling the prophecy of Isaiah 50:6-7, about the suffering servant’s cheeks being slapped, and His face being shamed and spit at. On the other hand, the Passion narratives make clear that Jesus is a most truthful prophet. Step-by-step, Jesus’ prophecies on this night all come true. He prophesied Judas’ betrayal (see John 13:21-26). He foretold how the disciples would fall away and scatter (see Matthew 26:31).

We will also see next, that Jesus predicted with great accuracy how Peter would deny Him three times before the cock crows (see Luke 22:34). **Reflection Questions** – Jesus suffers a torturous death on the Cross. But He also endures another kind of abuse: the chief priests slap Jesus, spit at Him, and mock Him. Which kind of abuse do you cause Jesus? Do you cause Him more suffering? Why? When do our choices cause Jesus to suffer? Imagine being Peter at the moment Jesus looks at him when the cock crowed. How would you feel at that moment? Now put yourself in Peter’s shoes the next time Jesus talks to him after the Resurrection, Peter denied Him three times! How would you feel when Jesus asked at that point, “Do you love me?” How would you respond? Jesus wants us to come to Him as we really are – with all our weakness, wounds, and sins – like Peter finally did when they met after Easter. Indeed, Jesus wants to meet the real you – not the one you wish you could be, or the one you like to project to others. How comfortable are you coming before Jesus humble and vulnerable like this? What keeps you from doing this more

fully and more often? When was the last time you received the Sacrament of Penance? Please take time to attend our Parish Penance Service on Wednesday, March 13th. We are all in need of Jesus’ mercy and forgiveness. This is the reason Jesus suffered His Passion for us.

Please invite someone to Mass.

Sacraments

Baptism

Marriage

Arrangements must be made with a priest at least 6 months prior to wedding date. Pre-Cana classes are required, contact Church office at 610-834-1975.

Primarily intended as prayers and anointing for healing from serious illness or as a spiritual preparation before surgery. Last Rites or Extreme Unction are for those in danger of imminent death.

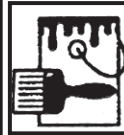
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
