

Dear St. Philip Neri Families & Friends



We give praise and thanks to God for the graces He has given us. Today, our readings present us with profound insights into the nature of sin, redemption, and the boundless love of God. From the moment of humanity's fall in the Garden of Eden to the misunderstandings Jesus faced during His ministry, we see a continuous thread of God's redemptive love. And in a special way, this month we celebrate the Sacred Heart of Jesus, a devotion that encapsulates this divine love in its most tender and compassionate form. In our first reading from Genesis, we hear the tragic aftermath of Adam and Eve's disobedience. God calls out to Adam, "Where are you?". This question, though simple, carries deep significance. It is not merely about Adam's physical location but his spiritual state. Adam and Eve have hidden themselves out of shame and fear, having broken the intimate relationship they enjoyed with God. God's response to their sin is not one of immediate wrath but of a promise. He speaks of enmity between the serpent and the woman, and between the serpent's offspring and hers. This is the protoevangelium, the first gospel, where God promises a Savior who will crush the serpent's head. Even in the midst of sin and its consequences, God's love and mercy shine through with a promise of redemption.

In the Gospel of Mark, we encounter Jesus amid His ministry, His family, concerned about His wellbeing, thinks He is "out of His mind." The scribes accuse Him of being possessed by Beelzebul. Jesus responds with wisdom, showing the absurdity of their accusations; "How can Satan cast out Satan?". He then speaks of the unforgivable sin against the Holy Spirit, which is the persistent rejection of God's grace. Jesus' words about His true family are particularly striking. "Whoever does the will of God is my brother and sister and mother." Here, Jesus expands the concept of family beyond blood

relations to include all who follow God's will. This redefinition underscores the inclusivity of God's kingdom and the boundless love that Jesus offers to all who believe in Him. Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus perfectly encapsulates the themes of today's readings. The heart is a universal symbol of love, and the Sacred Heart of Jesus represents His infinite and tender love for humanity. It is a heart that loves us despite our sins, a heart that seeks us

out when we are lost, and a heart that offers itself completely for our redemption. In the image of the Sacred Heart, we see a heart encircled by a crown of thorns, pierced and bleeding. The imagery reminds us of Jesus' suffering and the extent of His love – He gave everything for us. His heart burns with a love that is personal and intimate, inviting us into a deeper

relationship with Him. As we reflect on these readings and the devotion to the Sacred Heart, let us be reminded of God's unending love for us. From the promise of redemption in Genesis to Jesus' ministry on earth, culminating in the ultimate act of love on the cross, God's love is relentless and transformative. Let us respond to this love by striving to do the will of God, becoming true brothers and sisters of Christ. Let us approach the Sacred Heart of Jesus with confidence, seeking His mercy and allowing His love to penetrate our heart, transforming our lives and the world around us. *May the Sacred Heart of Jesus, so loving and so tender, be our refuge and strength, now and forever. Amen.*

St. Barnabas / Feast Day – June 11th

Though not one of the 12 apostles, he is regarded as one of the 72 disciples of Christ and one of the most respected men in the 1st century Church. He introduced St. Paul to the Apostles after his conversion. He committed himself in a radical way to the teachings of Christ. He sold all his property and gave the money to the early Church, and traveled to Antioch with Paul and was a staunch defender of the Gentiles. His missionary zeal to preach the Gospel and gather souls for Christ was legendary. He is believed to have been stoned to death in Cyprus around 62 AD for his preaching and success in converting souls. It is saints like him that laid the foundations of the early Church, and we are still here over 2000 years later.




