

Mission Co-op Collection

Pontifical Mission Societies in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia, to benefit the Oblates of the Virgin Mary. This group began a mission in the Philippines in the mid 1990's conducting retreats based on the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius. Today they run a retreat center and Novitiate House of Theology. They educate Filipino seminarians in formation for the priesthood. The Philippines is a very poor country and seminarians do not have the means to afford the education. The Oblates shoulder the full cost of educating these young men for the priesthood. It costs \$10,000 a year to feed, clothe and educate each seminarian. Please be generous and thank you for your support of our Mission Church in the Philippines.

Dear St. Philip Neri Families & Friends

We give praise and thanks to God for the graces He has given us. Today, the Gospel of Mark recounts Jesus sending out the Twelve Apostles on their mission. He gives them authority over unclean spirits and instructs them to take nothing for the journey except a staff – no bread, no bag, no money in their belts – wear sandals but not an extra tunic.

Jesus' instructions to the Apostles are rich with meaning and offer us profound lessons about discipleship, trust, and the mission of the Church. First, Jesus sends the Apostles out two by two. This is a reminder that our faith journey is not solitary. We are called to community and companionship. The support and accountability provided by a fellow disciple can sustain us through challenges and amplify our witness to the Gospel. In our parish and in our lives, we should seek to build and nurture relationships that

strengthen our faith and our commitment to Christ's mission. Secondly, Jesus gives the Apostles authority over unclean spirits. This authority is not theirs by merit but a gift from Christ, emphasizing that all our good works and victories over sin are by God's grace. As Christians, we are entrusted with the mission to confront and overcome evil in its many forms – whether it be injustice, hatred, or sin in our own hearts. We do this not by our own power but through the power of Christ working in us. The instructions

to take nothing for the journey except a staff are particularly striking. Jesus wants the Apostles to depend entirely on God and the hospitality of those they meet. This radical trust challenges us to reflect on our own lives. How often do we rely on material security, status, or our own abilities, rather than trusting in God's providence? Jesus calls us to simplicity and a deep trust in God's care for us. This trust is not naïve but rooted in the conviction that God

knows our needs and will provide. Furthermore, Jesus instructs the Apostles to stay in one house until they leave the area. This teaches us about commitment and presence. In our fast-paced world, it is easy to move quickly from one thing to another, but Jesus calls us to be fully present where we are and to commit to the people and the work God has placed before us. Finally, the Apostles mission was one of preaching repentance, casting out demons, and healing the

sick. This comprehensive mission reflects the holistic nature of the Gospel – it addresses spiritual, physical, and emotional needs. As the Church, our mission is not only to proclaim the Gospel, but also to live it out by caring for those in need, advocating for justice, and being a healing presence in the world. Brothers and sisters, today's Gospel invites us to embrace our call to discipleship with trust and simplicity. Let us support one another in our journey of faith, rely on God's providence, and commit ourselves to the mission of the Church. May we, like the Apostles, go out with the authority of Christ, bringing His Word, love, graces, healing, and peace to all we meet. Let us pray for

the grace to trust in God's provision, to be bold in our witness, and to remain committed to the mission entrusted to us. May God bless you all!

Baptism

Our Lady of Mount Carmel



Mount Carmel is a mountain range in Northern Israel overlooking the Mediterranean. Its name is from the Hebrew "Karem El", meaning "vineyards of God". Mount Carmel is mentioned in Egyptian records as a "holy mountain" as early as the 16th century B.C. Its great height made it a center of idol worship and was

indeed the very place Elijah confronted the false prophets of Baal (1 Kings 18). Hermits lived on Carmel in the 12th century, there was a chapel dedicated there to Our Lady and they became known as the "Brothers of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel". They celebrated a special Mass and Office in honor of Mary, in 1726, it became a celebration of the universal Church. For centuries the Carmelites have seen themselves as specially related to Mary notably by championing the mystery of her Immaculate Conception. Facing persecution from Muslims, a majority of the monks decided to move to Europe. There they established centers of learning and continued on their mission to preach the Gospel.

Tradition has it that the Blessed Mother appeared to a Carmelite, St. Simon Stock, and presented him with a Scapular and told him, "This will be a privilege for you and for all Carmelites, that who dies in this will not suffer eternal fire." This vision was the source of the Brown Scapular devotion – a tradition which involves the wearing of an adapted version of the garment, along with certain spiritual commitments, by lay Catholics as well as priests and religious. Our shrine next to the Church is dedicated to Our Lady of Mount Carmel.

Her feast day is July 16th.




