

November is the Month of All Souls

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches that “every spiritual soul is created immediately by God – it is not “produced” by the parents – and also that it is immortal: it does not perish when it separates from the body at death, and it will be reunited with the body at the final resurrection.”

We give praise and thanks to God for the graces and blessings He has given us. In 1 Kings 17:10-16, Elijah meets a poor widow in Zarephath during a famine and asks her for water and a small loaf of bread. The widow has only a handful of flour and a little oil, barely enough for herself and her son. Yet, in faith, she obeys Elijah's request. God miraculously sustains her jar of flour and jug of oil, providing for her family until the drought ends. This message shows us:

- **Trust in God's Provision:** The widow's obedience to Elijah's request, despite her scarcity, reveals her deep trust in God. Even in our poverty, God asks us to trust in His goodness.

- **God's Abundance in our Need:** God provides for those who act in faith. Through her means were limited, her faith allowed God's blessing to multiply.

- **Selflessness and Generosity:** The widow shared her last meal with Elijah. Her selflessness demonstrates that generosity often requires a sacrifice of something we hold dear.

In our Gospel, Jesus observes people giving offerings at the Temple. Many wealthy people contribute large amounts, but a poor widow offers two small coins – "all she had to live on." Jesus praises her sacrificial giving, emphasizing that she gave "more" than the others because she gave from her poverty, not her surplus. What Jesus is teaching us:

- **True Generosity:** God values the spirit in which we give, not the amount. The widow's humble gift was priceless because it came from her heart.

- **Simplicity and Humility:** Jesus cautions against seeking honor or recognition for our faith. He calls His followers to live humbly, rather than pursuing external displays of piety.

This is not always easy to live.

- **Sacrificial Love:** The widow gave all she had, showing that true love often involves self-sacrifice. This foreshadows Jesus' own self-giving on the Cross.

Both widows exemplify faith and trust in God, even amidst scarcity. Their actions call us to examine our own generosity and faith. Are we willing to trust God with everything we have, even if it's little? Do we give out of our abundance or with a sacrificial spirit? And are we living humbly, focused on serving rather than being seen? In this way, these passages remind us that God calls us to a generosity that stems from love and trust, not simply duty. When we give from our hearts, even the smallest act of kindness can become an instrument of His grace and blessing.

May God bless you all, please invite someone to Mass today.



Baptism

Baptisms are scheduled on the 2nd & 4th Sunday of every month immediately following the 11AM Mass.

Godparents need Letters of Eligibility, for first time parents the Pre-Jordan Class is required. Call the Church Office at 610-834-1975 to make arrangements.

Marriage

Arrangements must be made with a priest at least 6 months prior to wedding date. Pre-Cana classes are required, contact Church office at 610-834-1975.

Primarily intended as prayers and anointing for healing from serious illness or as a spiritual preparation before surgery. Last Rites or Extreme Unction are for those in danger of imminent death. Call rectory or Church Office.


