



Archbishop Pérez's Pastoral Letter

Archbishop Pérez published a Pastoral Letter on Sunday, January 5th. This letter outlines his hopes for the Church of Philadelphia over the coming years. We give praise and thanks to God for the graces and blessings He has given us. Today's readings invite us to reflect on God's call in our lives and our response to Him. Both Isaiah and Peter experienced an overwhelming sense of unworthiness when they encountered the Divine Presence. Yet, God reassured them, cleansed them, and called them to a greater mission. In the first reading, Isaiah sees a vision of the Lord in His glory. Overcome with awe and humility, he exclaims, "Woe is me! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips." But God, in His mercy, purifies Isaiah's lips with a burning coal, removing his sin and preparing him for service. When the Lord asks, "Whom shall I send?" Isaiah responds courageously, "Here I am; send me!" Similarly, in the Gospel, Peter is confronted with the power of Jesus when he witnesses the miraculous catch of fish. Realizing his own sinfulness, he falls to his knees and says, "Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man." Yet, Jesus does not turn away from Peter's weakness; instead, He calls him to a greater mission: "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men." Like Isaiah and Peter, we may sometimes feel unworthy of God's call. We may think that our sins, weakness, or fears disqualify us from serving Him. But God does not call the perfect; He perfects those whom He calls. He invites us to trust in His grace and step forward in faith.

How is God calling us to go deeper?

Jesus told Peter to "put out into the deep." This is also Jesus' invitation to us. God is asking us to trust Him more, to step beyond our comfort zones, and to be His instruments of love and grace. This moment is not just about a miraculous catch of fish; it is about trust, surrender, and allowing God to work through us. He has given each of us gifts and talents – not for ourselves alone, but to build up His Church and serve our brothers and sisters. Perhaps God is calling us to be involved in our parish, to volunteer our time, to use our talents in ministry, or to reach out to those in need. Maybe He is inviting us to deepen our prayer life, to trust Him more in difficult situations, or to share our faith with others. Whatever it may be, Jesus assures us, as He did Peter, that we do not walk alone. He is with us, strengthening us, guiding us, and giving us the faith we need. Peter, after a long night of fruitless labor, is exhausted. Yet, at the word of Jesus, he obeys; "Master, we have toiled all night and caught nothing, but at your word, I will let down the nets." This simple act of trust leads to an overwhelming blessing. The nets are filled beyond capacity, and Peter, recognizing the divine power of Jesus, falls to his knees in humility and awe. Like Peter, we are being called to put out into the deep – to trust in God even when circumstances seem hopeless. The Lord is inviting us to go beyond our comfort zones, to use our gifts and talents in service of others, and to have faith that He is always with us.

Trusting in the Lord's Presence.

Do we truly believe that the Lord is with us in every moment? Do we trust that He will provide for us, guide us, and strengthen us? The story of Peter reminds us that Jesus does not abandon us. He stays with us, just as He stayed with Peter, filling his nets and his heart with faith. In our struggles, uncertainties, and fears, Jesus is saying, "Do not be afraid. I am with you."

Using Our Gifts for the Church and Community.

God has given each of us gifts and talents. He does not want us to keep them to ourselves but to use them for the good of our parish, our families, and our communities. How can we allow Jesus to work through us?

- By serving in our parish ministries, sharing our time and talents.
- By reaching out to those in need, offering kindness and compassion.
- By strengthening our families with love, faith and forgiveness.
- By being a witness of Christ's presence in our daily lives.

Stepping out in Faith.

Jesus is asking us today; "**Will you go further with me? Do you trust me? Do you believe that I am working through you?** Just as Peter left his boat to follow Christ, we are called to step out in faith and embrace God's plan for our lives. It may not always be easy, but with Jesus, our efforts will bear fruit beyond our imagination. Let us open our hearts and say, "**Here I am, Lord. Use me. Let your graces and blessings flow through me so that I may bring my brothers and sisters closer to You.**" May we trust in His love, follow His call, and cast our nets into the deep, knowing that with Christ, we will always be fulfilled.


