We give praise and thanks to God for the graces and blessings He has given us! On this third Sunday of Lent, we encounter Moses in a seemingly ordinary moment. He's tending his flock, minding his own business. His life, although marked by a deep history of exile and struggle, appears to be going on as usual. But then, in the midst of his daily work, something extraordinary happens: Moses sees a bush that is burning but not consumed. And as he approaches this strange sight, God calls out to him, "Moses! Moses!" This moment of encounter is both surprising and profound. Moses, like many of us, is simply doing his work when God suddenly breaks into his world. We often imagine the great moments of faith as planned and expected, as though they must happen in a holy space or a time of quiet reflection. Yet, in this passage, God's call comes while Moses is doing something completely ordinary. God doesn't wait for a perfect moment. He meets Moses where he is, in the midst of his everyday life. And this leads us to a crucial question for us during this season of Lent: Are we making room for God to speak to us in the midst of our ordinary lives? Or, are we consumed by the noise of the world – by the busyness of our schedules, the distractions of technology, the demands of daily life – that we miss His call? In our world today, it's so easy to be overwhelmed by the constant noise. We are inundated with information, social media, work pressures, and endless tasks that demand our attention. It can feel impossible to escape the noise long enough to hear God's voice. But Lent is a season when we are invited to fast – not only from food, but from the distractions and noise that keep us from hearing God. Moses could have easily ignored the burning bush, dismissing it as a trick of the eye or simply another strange thing in his world. But he chooses to approach it, to investigate, to listen. In doing so, he encounters God in a powerful way. This Lent, perhaps we can fast from the noise of our lives – whether it's the constant stream of social media, the clutter in our minds, or the busyness of our routines – and instead, carve out moments of silence to listen. Could we give God the space to speak to us, to draw us closer to Him? When God calls Moses, He calls him by name. "Moses! Moses!"

He doesn't just speak in general terms. He speaks personally, with care, as if to say, "I know you, and I am calling you." This is how God speaks to us as well. He knows each of us by name, and He wants to be in relationship with us, to draw us closer, just as He drew Moses out of the wilderness. God's call to Moses in the burning bush is not only a call to action – it's a call to relationship. It's an invitation to step out of our daily routines, to make room for God, and to let Him reveal His plans for us. He's not distant or silent. He's here, waiting for us to notice the burning bush in our own lives. This Lent, let's be mindful of the burning bushes around us. Where is God trying to get our attention? How is He calling us by name? And how can we, like Moses, stop, listen, and respond to His invitation? If we make room for God, He will speak. He will guide us. And He will lead us out of the wilderness into His loving presence. May we fast from the noise of the world this Lent, so that we can hear God's voice more clearly and draw closer to Him
