

**"I will get up and go to my father and shall say to him;
Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you."**



We give praise and thanks to God for the graces and blessings He has given us! In today's Gospel, we hear the beautiful parable of the Prodigal Son, a story that holds deep meaning for us as we journey through this Lenten Season. This passage from Luke invites us into the heart of God's mercy and forgiveness, reminding us of the boundless love of the Father and the transformative power of reconciliation. It's especially poignant as we approach the time for Confession in our parish (Penance Service, April 9th at 7PM) during this Lent. We all know the story; a younger son asks for his inheritance early, leaves his father's house, and squanders everything in a distant country. When a famine strikes, he finds himself in despair, working as a swineherd and longing for the food that the pigs eat! In his misery, he remembers his father's house and decides to return home, hoping to be received back as a servant.

But what happens next is nothing short of miraculous. The Gospel tells us that "while he was a long way off, his father saw him and was filled with compassion". The father runs to his son, embraces him, and kisses him. He doesn't wait for his son to come to him to beg forgiveness. No, the father runs to him, offering mercy before the son even speaks a word. Why did the father run to the son? In the cultural context of Jesus' time, this would have been unheard of, a father would never have run to a son, especially one who had dishonored him so profoundly by asking for his inheritance early. But the father's love transcends all expectations. He runs to his son because he cannot bear the thought of waiting another moment to welcome him back to the fold. His love is so great that he meets his son in his brokenness, before any words of repentance are spoken. This is the same love that God has for each of us. He runs to meet us, even when we feel unworthy, even when we have wandered far from Him. This Lenten season is a time for us to recognize how deeply God desires our return to Him, to experience His forgiveness and healing. Just like the father in the parable, God doesn't wait for us to be perfect or to have everything figured out. He is waiting with open arms, eager to forgive us and restore us to the fullness of His love. As we approach the Sacrament of Reconciliation during our parish's Lenten confessions, let us remember that this sacrament is not just about admitting our wrongdoings or fulfilling an obligation. It is a moment for us to encounter God's mercy in a profound and transformative way. Just as the father in the parable runs to his son, God runs to us through the priest in the confessional. In that moment, God's compassion is poured out upon us, wiping away our sins and giving us the grace to start anew. This Lent, I invite you to reflect on the ways in which you may have wandered from God, whether through sins of commission or omission, and to approach the Sacrament of Confession with an open heart. Remember that no matter how far we have strayed, God is always waiting, always ready to welcome us back, just as the father in the parable welcomed his son with joy and celebration, and when we return to Him, He will not only forgive us, He will also restore us to the fullness of His love, just as the father restored his son with a ring, a robe, and a feast. Let us take this opportunity during Lent to turn back to the Father, knowing that He is running to meet us, ready to embrace us with open arms. May we experience His mercy and love in a new and profound way and may this grace transform our hearts, making us more like Him each day.

The vestments for this day will be rose, replacing the solemn purple as they are on Gaudete Sunday in Advent.




